#### **Livestock Notables**



## **DNA SAMPLE COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **NEW FOR 2024**

Market livestock DNA will be collected via hair follicles. Nose prints and blood samples will no longer be accepted. Questions - Call/email Rhiannon Birdwell, Competitive Entry Supervisor 660.530.5616 / Rhiannon.Birdwell@mda.mo.gov

#### Instructions for pulling hair and placing in envelope:

- Pull hair with root follicles attached.
- Hair should be dry.
- If hair has excess dirt and debris, please brush out if possible.
- Do not cut the hair, the roots contain the DNA for testing.
- Use fingers or pliers to grasp approximately 8-10 hairs close to the skin and pull.
- Repeat until you have approximately 20-30 hairs with root follicles attached.
- Place 20-30 hairs with root follicles attached in a regular #10 envelope. Seal envelope.
- Clean hands and/or pliers before sampling another animal.

**Labeling envelope:** Before labeling, please verify that the ID of the animal matches the ID label on the hair sample envelope. Envelope should include the following:

- Exhibitor name
- Exhibitor address
- County of residence
- FFA Chapter or 4-H County
- Animal ID (ear notch, tattoo, ear tag)

#### **DNA Sample Deadlines:**

Market Steers and Heifers: postmarked by March 15, 2024 Market Barrows: postmarked by May 15, 2024

Market Lambs and Wether Goats: postmarked by June 15, 2024

Agriculture Teachers or Extension Agents must provide a signature to certify that the hair sample was taken from the entered animal in their presence and that the animal entered is owned by the exhibitor. The DNA sample and collection data form must be returned to the Missouri State Fair by the Agriculture Instructor or Extension Agent and sent to:

DNA submitted to the Missouri State Fair on all junior market animals become the property of the Missouri State Fair. Exhibitors relinquish any claim to said DNA samples when submitted as proof of ownership. DNA samples are stored in a secure environment at the Missouri State Fair and are destroyed in due time following the show. These samples will never be made available for cloning or any like procedure. In all market animals at the Missouri State Fair, any DNA samples that have been collected prior to the Sale of Champions Auction (with the exception of the DNA samples submitted to the Missouri State Fair as proof of ownership as stated above) will be considered to be the property of the exhibitor to use. Exhibitors will not be allowed to use at their discretion to collect any samples after the transfer of ownership via the "fall of the hammer" at the Sale of Champions Auction unless agreed upon in writing between the buyer and the seller.

#### **Missouri State 4-H Council Applications**

It is time to apply if you would like to serve on the youth governing board for the Missouri 4-H Program. In coordination with the Missouri 4-H Center for Youth Development, the State 4-H Council's charge is to represent youth interests throughout the state in matters of policy and programming so that the educational and developmental needs of Missouri 4-H'ers may best be addressed. Specific responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the planning and implementation of State Congress and to represent Missouri 4-H at the annual Missouri State Fair and the various state 4-H events across numerous programmatic areas such as public speaking, fashion revue, shooting sports, judging competitions, and leadership development events/trainings.

REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES give voice to regional perspectives in the context of the State Council. In addition, they represent Missouri 4-H in public contexts both within their counties and at regional and state-level events. There are eight regional representatives, one delegate representing each of the eight Missouri Extension regions.

THE MISSOURI 4-H STATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS consists of five individuals that have been elected by their peers to serve as the executive officers of the Missouri 4-H State Council and the highest-ranking youth officials within the Missouri 4-H Program. The positions are president, vice-president, and three state representatives. The board constitutes the most public facing delegation of Missouri 4-H membership because they formally represent the program to the University of Missouri, state and local government, friends and donors of 4-H, industry partners, and other key stakeholder groups. The board will preside over State Council meetings in addition to the annual Missouri 4-H State Congress.

#### Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassadors Applications

TThe purpose of the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador Program is to educate local policy makers, industry stakeholders, community partners, and 4-H'ers at the county and regional levels on the topics of land-grant history, 4-H program offerings, and servicelearning opportunities. Through this program, ambassadors can expect to develop meaningful professional connections as they seek to educate others on ways to engage with Extension and to positively contribute to their communities. Ambassadors are paramount to further connecting 4-H'ers with each other throughout the state and to developing social capital with individuals and entities directly and indirectly invested in the land-grant mission of the University of Missouri and the 4-H motto to Make the Best Better. Ambassadors are expected to engage with local policymakers that include county commission boards and local school boards. In addition, they are asked to connect with 4-H'ers and 4-H faculty in their region through county meetings, regional energizers, and service projects. Ambassadors will plan and preside over Missouri 4-H Teen Conference. In addition, they will be invited to represent Missouri 4-H at statewide events including but not limited to the Missouri State Fair, Legislative Academy, and State Congress. An ambassador's term begins at Missouri 4-H State Congress and lasts a calendar year from that event.



4-H Feeding Missouri began in 2018 as a partnership between Missouri 4-H and Feeding Missouri. Our goal was to bring awareness to the issue of food insecurity and to encourage our members and volunteers to take action in their own communities to fight hunger. This is the 6th year for 4-H Feeding Missouri and so far we have provided over 1 million meals to Missourians. This year our goal is to provide 277,000 meals for the food insecure, which will push us over the 2 million meal benchmark for the life of this program. The friendly competition for members across the state kicks off January 1st and will run through April 30th.

## **State 4-H Meats Judging Contest**

The meat industry is an important component of the Missouri Agriculture Industry. The Meat Identification and Judging Contest has been developed to encourage 4-H members to develop skills and abilities needed to enter and advance in careers in the meat industry. These activities are designed to encourage the development of broader analytical skills, critical thinking, the use and understanding of appropriate meat terminology, and the evaluation of meat animal products to optimize economic returns not only to themselves as producers, but also as consumers.

Classes will include both wholesale and retail cuts, including one or more sets of reasons. Identification includes thirty cuts of beef, pork, and lamb. Registration for the State Contest being held Saturday, February 17, 2024 will be through 4-H Online between December 28, 2023 and January 29, 2024 at a cost of \$25 per youth.





#### 2024 Missouri 4-H Equine Tour

4-H Teens, ages 14-18, who are dreaming of an equine-related career, this is the opportunity for you! The 2024 Equine tour will travel to Colorado and explore the equine industry present along the way. The anticipated cost of this experience is \$850 per youth. There is a new timeline for the 2024 State Livestock Judging Contest! Judging will consist of placing classes of breeding and/or market beef, swine, sheep, and goats, reasons classes where youth will be required to place a class and present a set of oral reasons explaining their placings, and questions classes where youth will answer a set of questions about the animals they observed.
